Depending on your request, the personnel will connect you with:

- the Police
- the Fire Brigade
- the emergency medical care (EKAB)
- the coast guard
- the National Telephone Line SOS: 1056
- the European Line for disappeared children: 116000.

#### Where can I get medicines if I need them?

For all those visiting a Department of Emergency cases in any hospital, following a doctor's referral from a Hospitality Centre for refugees and migrants, and regardless of a K.Y. $\Pi$ .A possession, the medicines are provided FOR FREE.

You can also buy prescribed medicines from any pharmacy without paying anything.

#### ATTENTION!!

Most medicines are prescribed by a doctor, otherwise, the pharmacist it will not give it to you. In pharmacies you will also find the so-called "over-the-counter medicines". These are drugs that you can buy without a prescription, but paying the full price.

# Greek health service navigation guide

for migrants





#### What are my health care rights in Greece?

According to the Organisation for Fundamental Rights of European Union Agency (FRA)<sup>1</sup>, all refugees / immigrants should have access to services of urgent sanitary care, in equivalent basis with the nationals of each reception country. Also, they participate or they are exempted by the relative sanitary expenses, with their base same rules.

The Greek State, with the Law 4368/2016 and the Common Ministerial Decision A3( $\gamma$ )/ $\Gamma\Pi$ /o $\iota\kappa$ .25132/4-4-2016 provides all refugees / immigrants with the right of free access to all public health structures for the benefit of nursing, medical and pharmaceutical care.

#### How can I access Greek health care services?

In Greece, those who are non-insured (included the pregnant women, the minors, suffering from chronic diseases etc.) and do not allocate Registration Number (A.M.K.A) of Social Insurance or they cannot publish, they hould essentially possess Card of Sanitary Care of Foreigner (K.Y.Π.A.).

You can apply for publishing A.M.K.A. and Sanitary Number Care of Foreigner (A.Y.Π.A.) by going to any Service Centre for Citizens (Κ.Ε.Π.) (http://www.kep.gov.gr/portal/page/portal/kep), while you can acquire the K.Y.Π.A from the Offices for Protection the Rights of Services Health Recipients or from the Hospital Social Services of your region.

The K.Y.  $\Pi$ . A is in effect for 6-month, unless it concerns pregnant woman, where she is annual. Can renew the K.Y.  $\Pi$ . A in any hospital.

#### What health care services are available in Greece?

In Greece, health care is provided via the hospitals, the Units of Mental Health, the Units of Primary Health Care of the National Health System (E. $\Sigma$ .Y.), the General hospitals and the Municipal Surgeries that are overseen by the Ministry of Health and the Ministry of Education, Research and Religion, as well as via the Institutions of re-establishment and Social Care that are overseen by the Ministry of Labor, Social Insurance and Social Solidarity.

All citizens, no matter of their nationality, legal status or possession of legitimizing documents, can be accepted in all primary health care structures and the Emergency Departments of all Hospitals.

## What to do in medical emergency?

Go to the Doctor's Office at the Hospitality Centre or contact the person in charge of the Centre!

Doctors who provide services – if necessary - will admit you at the Emergency Department of the nearest Hospital. You will be accepted there!

Regardless of your possession of K.Y. $\Pi$ .A., doctors will provided diagnostic examinations and medicines from hospital's pharmacy, and hospitalisation – if needed - FRFF OF CHARGE.

If you are in an emergency situation OUSIDE the Hospitality Centre, you can call the Emergency telephone EKAB: 166

An EKAB ambulance will take you to the Emergency Department of a hospital.
